Ms. Nanayakkara stated it was a pleasure working for the Pension Fund and thanked the Board for the opportunity.

DISABILITY COMMITTEE

Mr. Reed reported that in addition to having had a second hearing for a disability pension for Firefighter Timothy H. Harmon, the Disability Committee had also received information from Staff regarding the employment of two of its current disability pensioners. The Committee had previously directed Staff to conduct some research on the two pensioners to determine whether the work they were performing warranted a reduction in their annuity. After receiving the information, the Committee decided to take no action.

LEGISLATIVE COMMITTEE

Vice Chairman Smith reported the Legislative Committee did not meet this month; however, he stated there have been several Pension Review Board meetings. He stated the next meeting is scheduled for August 4th at 10:00 a.m. and will be held at the Capitol in Austin.
